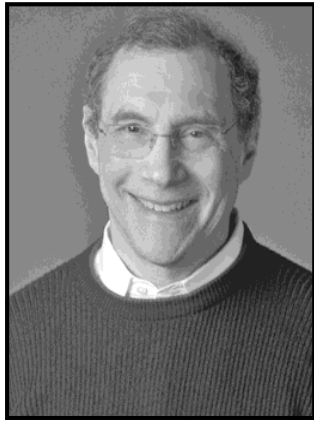

*Gene Dattel grew up in the cotton country of the Mississippi Delta. He has given numerous presentations based on his widely acclaimed book, *Cotton and Race in the Making of America* to a diverse group of public and private audiences from Massachusetts to Florida. Dattel studied history at Yale and law at Vanderbilt. He then embarked on a twenty-year career in financial capital markets as a managing director at Salomon Brothers and Morgan Stanley. Fifteen of those years were spent working in financial markets overseas - in London, Hong Kong, and Tokyo. A consultant to major financial institutions and the Pentagon, he established a reputation as a foremost authority on Asian economies. His “*The Sun that Never Rose*” (1994) remains a critical guide to Japanese financial malaise. Mr. Dattel is now a New York/Connecticut-based financial historian who lectures widely.*
